The Service:

The Victims First Hub acts as a 'one front door' to all services in Thames Valley to ensure victims can get the support they need to help them to cope and to recover.

Victims First provides free, confidential, non-discriminatory emotional and practical support to all victims and in some instances their family members in accordance with their needs and the harm caused by the crime. Victims First has a number of specialist services which includes help for victims of sexual violence and domestic abuse. We may refer into one of our specialist core services which includes:

- Victims First Emotional Support Service
- Victims First Adults Specialist Service
- Victims First Specialist Counselling Service
- Victims First Young Victims Service

Provides advice, support and counselling to individuals in Buckinghamshire and Milton Keynes whose lives have been affected by rape, sexual assault and abuse.

- Independent Domestic and Sexual Advisor (IDSVA) for male victims advocacy and support including support through the criminal justice process.
- Counselling therapeutic support to help relieve the psychological, emotional, and physical distress suffered by rape, sexual assault and abuse.

Advocacy After Fatal Domestic Abuse (AAFDA)

Advocates for families after the homicide or suicide of their family member or friend, following domestic abuse.

The Service:

Specialist and expert Advocates are highly trained and knowledgeable in all aspects of domestic abuse and the processes following domestic homicide or suicide.

The service is client led and includes the following:

- Listening with understanding and compassion.
- Ensuring the voice of family members affected by fatal domestic abuse is heard.
- Provision of specialist and expert Advocates.
- Use of expertise to advocate for families during domestic homicide reviews, Inquests, serious case reviews, mental health reviews, and similar inquiries.
- Peer support bringing together of families to share their story.

DOMESTIC ABUSE/WOMEN

Aylesbury Women's Aid

Provides support for women, children and young people who are, or have been, affected by domestic abuse.

The Service:

- Counselling providing eight 50-minute sessions, with the possibility for additional session, up to a maximum of 12 sessions to domestic abuse victims in Aylesbury and surrounding areas.
- Clients can be signposted to this service, but must self- refer.

BRAVE (Building Resilience and Valuing Emotions)

- BRAVE is a service providing therapeutic support for victims of domestic abuse with additional emotional or psychological difficulties.
- 12-week group programme covers topics such as the function of emotions, low mood, anxiety, distress tolerance, building resilience, healthy relationships, and values.
- Graduates of the 12-week programme are invited to join BRAVE EMBRACE, a co-produced peer group where they can consolidate their skills and continue to receive support.
- BRAVE Too is a new service specially designed to engage male victims of Domestic Abuse.

Domestic Abuse & Exploitation Counselling Service, Browns Community Services CIC

Provides a range of support and advice to socially excluded, disadvantaged and vulnerable adults and families.

Counselling:

- Up to 18 free counselling sessions to adults.
- A safe, confidential space to explore experiences of abuse and any underlying issues.
- Counselling sessions are offered remotely via telephone or online using the Zoom platform.

- Children's Independent Domestic Violence Advisor (CHIDVA) for children and young people.
 - 1-2-1 support to children who have witnessed domestic abuse and have behavioural or emotional difficulties as a result.
 - Deliver training and healthy relationships workshops in schools and youth settings.
- Older persons Independent Domestic Abuse Advisor (IDVA) supporting women and men aged over 55 years.

Flag DV

Helps people experiencing domestic abuse or violence from their partners, ex-partners or family members to access specialist advice and support.

The Service:

Offer a free legal advice appointment (telephone or face to face) with a volunteer solicitor, legal executive or barrister who specialises in Family Law.

The clinic provides advice around:

- Divorce or separation.
- Child custody, residency and arrangements including contact with a child in care.
- Advice about the legal aid process and application.
- Advice regarding non-molestation orders, occupational orders, forced marriage protection orders. (Note this is advice only, we are unable to arrange these orders on your behalf).
- Financial matters such as maintenance, division of assets.
- General court proceedings understanding.

Services:

Counselling

Specialist Independent Sexual Violence Advisor

• Supporting older survivors of sexual violence and survivors with physical, learning or sensory disabilities.

Children and young people Independent Sexual Violence Advisor

• Supporting children and young people who are survivors of sexual violence.

Both Independent Sexual Violence Advisors:

- Provide information and support to victims and survivors who have reported to the police, or are yet to decide if they want to report.
- As well as advocacy, all service users are offered support via counselling, support and drop-in groups, psychoeducation programme and listening services.

Bounce Back 4 Kids (BB4K)

Support programme developed by PACT that uses therapeutic techniques to support children who have been affected by or witnessed domestic abuse.

Services:

Support is tailored to be responsive to the needs of families but can include individual support, group work, online workshops and courses, play therapy, other therapeutic sessions.

Support is provided to the child and the non-abusive parent, and both must want to access support and be able and ready to attend.

Reducing the Risk of Domestic Abuse

Dedicated to the safety of adults and children at risk of domestic abuse and to the empowerment of the professionals and volunteers who support them.

- Provision of a court Independent Domestic Violence Advisor who supports victims of domestic abuse who are going through the Criminal Justice System and/or applying for civil orders such as non-molestation/occupation orders to protect themselves and their families.
- Supporting domestic abuse victims in court following a DVPN/O being issued.

DOMESTIC ABUSE/SEXUAL VIOLENCE/CHILDREN

SAFE! Support for Young People Affected by Crime

Provides support to children and families around the Thames Valley who have been affected by crime or abuse through one-to-one and group sessions

Services:

- Children's Independent Domestic and Sexual Violence Advisors (CHISVAs) providing advocacy support to children and their
 families who are going through a criminal justice process, or who need help to report, following an experience of sexual harm
 or domestic abuse.
- Specialist Domestic and Sexual Violence Project Workers provide one-to-one emotional and practical recovery support to children at any stage after an experience of sexual harm or domestic abuse.
- Project workers run DAY (Domestic Abuse and Young) programme groups for children (aged 11 to 18) which focus on healthy relationships and peer support. DAY explores healthy and abusive behaviours in relationships using a multi-media and interactive approach. It also includes protective behaviour activities and opportunities to build positive peer relationships. Groups will run twice a year in each county.

Who can it support?

- Children aged 5- 18 for ISVA and IDVA provision and one-to-one emotional and practical support.
- Children aged 11 -18 for DAY programme

SEXUAL VIOLENCE/MEN/CHILDREN

Trust House Reading

Providing support to survivors of sexual violence and abuse.

Services:

- o Children's Independent Sexual Violence Advisor (CHISVA) supporting children and young people affected by rape, sexual abuse and child sexual exploitation. Includes supporting parents with the investigation and court, providing emotional and practical support through the civil court system (e.g. family court, care proceedings), liaison with other professionals.
- o Male Independent Sexual Violence Advisor (ISVA) providing advocacy support and help for individuals who are going through a criminal justice process, or who need help to report, following an experience of rape or sexual violence.
- Outreach work in local communities raising awareness about the sexual abuse among men and boys.

- Adult Men who have experienced rape and sexual violence (MALE ISVA)
- Children and young people aged 4 20 years old who have been affected by rape, sexual abuse or child sexual exploitation (CHISVA)

SEXUAL VIOLENCE/ETHNIC MINORITIES

Victims First Specialist Service (VFSS)

Provides free emotional and practical support to victims of crime across the Thames Valley.

- O Supports adults across Thames Valley who have experienced traumatic crimes. Activities are designed to increase confidence, make individuals more resilient and improve future safety.
- Has three Independent Sexual Violence Advisors (ISVAs) located in each county of Thames Valley who specialise in supporting people from diverse communities and those who may not ordinarily access services through the usual pathways.
- O Support includes but is not limited to support with reporting, advocacy throughout the CJS process, emotional support throughout, practical support with issues such as housing, health care and finances, immigration and accessing other services where appropriate. The support is not time restricted and will remain in place for as long as there are relevant needs present.
- o Provides access to specialist ISVAs/IDVAs/Restorative Justice and specialist support for those affected by Modern Slavery.
